### From the President:

Hello, and welcome to the Spring issue of the Friends' newsletter. It has been a tough winter for all of us, and we are, I am sure, more than ready for warm weather.

Winter was a busy time for the Friends. We held our 5th Open Juried Art Show in November, our annual basket display and raffle from mid November to mid December, and our 4th Open Juried Photography Show in February. These events generated more than \$3,000 to fund additional ESL and computer classes, e-book and video purchases, movie licensing fees and other items for the library.

In addition, we provided **renewed or first-time passes** to the Children's Museum, which includes the Roaring Brook Nature Center and the Children's Preschool Museum in West Hartford, CT; the Zoo at Forest Park, and The Mount (Edith Wharton's home) in Lenox, MA, all available to library patrons.

To accommodate ever-growing interest in the Friends' activities, at our annual meeting in February we voted to increase the number of seats on our Board to ten. At that time, we also elected Pamela Pudlo as our newest Board member. Pam has long been an active member of the Friends, and we welcome her expanded participation.

May heralds our **Annual Book Sale**. As always, Friends may use their complimentary coupons either day of the sale and attend Friday's sale day free of charge.

We are planning our first **Open Juried 3D Art Object Show in June** which would include five categories: two in sculpture (traditional/single media; contemporary/mixed media) and three in artisan/craft (jewelry/metals/glass; furniture/wood/fabrics; and ceramics/gourds). Our moving ahead with this show is contingent on the participation of a sufficient number of artists. We're hearing from many now and are getting excited. Mark your calendars for this and the other events we'll bring your way this year. Plan to be with us and at the library often. And have a great summer!

The sale is 100% donor and volunteer driven. All revenue benefits the library directly. Sales are cash only.
