The Agawam Public Library Has A Newly Designed Web Site!!

The Library's newly designed web site is not only very attractive but chock full of useful information and easier to navigate than ever. Go there to register for events and classes, see information about the Library, its staff, museum passes, the Friends page and so much more.

On the Friends page (www.agawamlibrary.org/about/friends), you'll find a statement about what we do and links to our Membership/Renewal Application, guidelines for the Holiday Baskets, the 2015/2016 calendar of meetings and events, and prospectuses/entry forms for our various art and photography shows. You'll also see links that will take you to photos of the winning entries from past art, photography and 3D art object shows, always a treat to see anew.

If you haven't yet set up access to your personal Library account, consider doing so now. From the convenience of your home, you can check the status of any items you've checked out, renew items, search the catalogue of all participating Central and Western Massachusetts libraries and reserve an item for pick-up at the Agawam Library, regardless of which library is lending the item. Remember, too, that the Library lends e-books, so you don't have to risk a drive to pick up books in inclement weather. Using Library services couldn't be easier. If you have questions about on-line access or downloading e-materials, ask a librarian. The staff are always eager to help you and your family make the most of the multitude of offerings the Library provides.

October's selection is the best-selling <u>The Boys in the Boat: Nine Americans and Their Epic Quest for Gold at the 1936 Berlin Olympics</u>, by Daniel Brown. The University of Washington was destined to remain nowhere in the world of collegiate sculling until a gangly, callow group of freshmen converged at the campus boat house one September morning. A committed coach would drive these boys to a glory they'd never dreamed of, and a master boat builder would give them the exquisitely crafted scull they would oar to victory. The lives of the boys who became the 1936 winning crew - their histories, their tribulations, their personal pain, their triumphs - were well researched by Brown, who describes laudable characters to ache for and rejoice with. Action aficionados will appreciate Brown's page-turning treatment of the epic 1936 Olympic challenge as well as races won and lost on the way to the gold. If you haven't read this book yet, you're in for a treat.
