If you can, separate items for the children's/young people's room and deliver them to the Children's Department. All other donations may be left with a librarian at the Main Circulation Desk.

We've had the library of a local minister come our way, so for the first time in quite a while, we'll have a special section devoted to religious themes, including inspirational writings, church histories, church management and philosophical issues. These selections balance out the wild romance and dark mysteries that are always a big part of our Sale.

As you know, we do not sell books that have been heavily underlined. Many of these have come our way this year, though. Because they are in otherwise excellent condition, we'll make them available at a **special "free books" table**, so help yourself when you come to the Sale.

Reminders: 1) **Admission is free to Friends** both days of the sale. There is a \$3 admission charge for everyone else on Friday. 2) **Bring your coupon (enclosed)** with you so that you can take advantage of the \$1 savings offered to Friends. 3) **Sales are cash only.**

We count our **4th Open Juried Photography Show** in February a big success. The quality of the entries was so high that all entries were judged into the show! The judges said they had a difficult time choosing award winners, such was the level of talent. It seems our shows get better every year.
