I want to welcome all of you to the second installment of the Friends of the Agawam Public Library Newsletter. A lot of things have happened since the last issue in spring. For a start,

thanks to the over 15,000 books donated by the Agawam community, the Friends book sale made over \$3,300! With the profits that we have made with this sale we will be able to help provide the library with the funding for a "portable classroom". This new equipment will give the library the additional flexibility of providing training classes in other areas of the library besides their current computer area. This new flexibility will open up the possibility of additional computer-based classes. Also as a result of the book sale, we were able to donate over 60 audio tapes to the Agawam Senior Center for the center's library.

Another wonderful thing that happened over the summer is the new retaining wall and garden located near the front entrance of the library thanks to the efforts of Nicholas Cormier. Nick chose this undertaking as his Eagle Scout Service project. He asked for the Friends financial support and we gladly provided it. He started the project in July and finished by the end of August. He did a marvelous job. Stop by and check it out!

And lastly, our Friends group, the West Springfield Friends group, and the Southwick Friends group have initiated a new project: "Friends Meeting With Friends". Its purpose is to share information with other Friends groups in the Pioneer Valley so that we can all benefit from each others successes and failures. So far, in addition to those mentioned, the group also consists of representatives from the Chicopee, East Longmeadow, Holyoke, Longmeadow, Springfield and Wilbraham groups.
