An Interview with Pamela Weingart, Youth Services Librarian



It was my great pleasure to spend some time with Pamela Weingart, and bask in her enthusiasm for her work. After obtaining her Bachelors degree, Pamela had a few different jobs, but didn't find anything that 'clicked' until she took a job as a library assistant at the high school she had attended. She fell in love with library work, and the librarian there encouraged her to get her Masters degree, which she did at Simmons College in Boston. Pamela came to the Agawam library two years ago from the Westfield Atheneum. She was familiar with our library, since she was an Agawam library user. The library's reputation and the community support it receives were key factors in her decision to join the staff.

Pamela literally lights up when talking about the programs being planned for the Children's department. A computer coding class for young children is in the works, as well as weekly STEM classes, a "Cookies and Canvas" program (think "Paint and Sip" for kids), and a community project comparable to the Legos building program from last year. She and her staff are also already planning for next year's Summer Reading program. These will all support her goal to have the library be a community center which creates life-long learners.

Without hesitation, Pamela identified "the kids" as the favorite part of her job. Watching children get excited about a book, and sharing their excitement is "the best". She also enjoys watching families work together on the various programs and projects offered at the library. The most challenging part of her job is finding enough time in the day to accomplish all of the things she'd like to do. Pamela frequently commended her staff for generating lots of creative ideas, and working together so well.

When asked if she had any tips for parents to encourage reading, her response was "Come to the library". She also suggested reading everything in the environment, including traffic signs, labels, etc. Making a game of it will encourage kids to participate. Children should see their parents reading, and their parents should demonstrate excitement and enthusiasm about reading.

Pamela's favorite children's books include the Magic Tree House series by Mary Pope Osborne, and Mo Willems' "Should I Share My Ice Cream?" (She loves ice cream, and doesn't like to share it!) For personal reading, Pamela enjoys thrillers and mysteries.

Keep your eyes on the Children's library. Great things are happening there, with even greater things to come!
